Jack H. Reed, 87, of Gratz, passed away on September 28, 2024, at his home in Gratz. He was born in Manheim on August 26, 1937, a son of the late Evelyn Laudenslager Reed and George "Jiggs" Reed. Jack was a retired Elementary School teacher for Upper Dauphin School District and the owner of Reed's Inn and the Boardwalk in Gratz.

He was a member of Simeon United Lutheran Church, Gratz, the Masons, Tall Cedars of Lebanon, lifetime member of the Gratz Fire Company and on the Board of Directors at Gratz National Bank. Jack played baseball while attending Elizabethtown Collage. He played with the Valley View American Legion team winning the State championship in 1955 and the Twin County League State championship. Jack was inducted into the Allen-Rogowicz Chapter PA Sports Hall of Fame 2015. Jack was an avid New York Yankees fan, enjoyed playing cards, golfing and going to Penn National Race Track.

Jack is survived by his wife Virginia Kessler Reed; two daughters, Elizabeth Martz, Margaret (Terry) Koppenhaver; three granddaughters, Shayna (Kevin) Savage, Janine Koppenhaver, Sharda (Zeke) Conrad; grandson, Tyler Koppenhaver; great-granddaughters, Sedona, Indie and Raya.

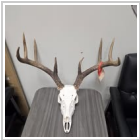
