Marlin L. Campbell, 86, of Herndon, went home to be with the Lord on Thursday, March 20, 2020 after a fall and the complications that followed. He died in his home surrounded by family.

Marlin was born on December 1, 1933, to Anna E. Raker Campbell and Marvin L. Campbell. He married Evelyn V. Reed, who survives, on April 4, 1959, they were married almost 61 years.
