Neil W. Schlegel, 89, of Pillow, passed away on April 15, 2015, at the Sunbury Community Hospital, Sunbury. He was born in Mandata on June 4, 1925, a son of the late Sidney and William Schlegel. Neil was employed at Wilhour Brothers Garage and later at Mekleys Limestone Products.
